SURVEY ANALYSIS TO CHECK THE CUSTOMER PREFERENCE : Generic vs Branded

For successful operation of any market, a healthy balance between the manufacturers and the consumers is required. The consumers play a dominant part in deciding the growth and development of any manufacturer.

Though in India also, domestic pharma companies have a major share but to have a better analysis on the market situation prevailing in India, we conducted a Survey to understand the preference of Consumers in India i.e., we wish to know that consumers prefer generic medicines or branded. In this survey, 4 questions were asked from the consumers of Delhi NCR region (educated class). No. of volunteers participated were 430. Comparative Data Analysis has been shown below.




Conclusion: Results showed that brand and price was the choice of customers but brand was the priority, less trust on Indian medicines hence customers rely on international branded products, some are not aware of the Jan Aushadhi Scheme started by government which gives cheaper generic medicine and others don't prefer such schemes.


TRAINING AND PLACEMENT ACTIVITIES


PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT CLASSES

Drug Regulatory Affairs-An interview

What is regulatory affairs?

Regulatory affairs department ensures that products should be developed from the desire of governments to protect public health by controlling the safety and efficacy of products in areas including pharmaceuticals, veterinary medicines, medical devices, cosmetics and complementary medicines. The companies responsible for the discovery, testing, manufacture and marketing of these products also want to ensure that they supply products that are safe and make a worthwhile contribution to public health and welfare.

Responsibilities of Regulatory personnel:

The responsibilities of RA personnel in general can be summarized into three

1. Ensuring that their companies comply with all of the regulations and laws pertaining to their business

Regulatory Affairs and its Role in Pharmaceutical Industry


