## FEAR MANAGEMENT

### **What Is Fear... As Per Sadhguru**

Fear is simply because you are not living with life, you are living in your mind. Your fear is always about what's going to happen next. That means your fear is always about that which does not exist. If your fear is about the non-existent, your fear is hundred percent imaginary. If you are suffering the non-existent, it is insanity. So, people may be in just socially accepted levels of insanity, but if you're afraid or if you're suffering anything which does not exist, it amounts to insanity, isn't it?

### **As per Modern Science**

Fear is a feeling induced by perceived danger or threat that occurs in certain types of organisms, which causes a change in metabolic and organ functions and ultimately a change in behavior, such as fleeing, hiding, or freezing from perceived traumatic events. Fear in human beings may occur in response to a specific stimulus occurring in the present, or in anticipation or expectation of a future threat perceived as a risk to body or life. The fear response arises from the perception of danger leading to confrontation with or escape from/avoiding the threat (also known as the fight-or-flight response), which in extreme cases of fear (horror and terror) can be a freeze response or paralysis.

Fear is of two kinds one is Natural or rational fear, when there is a threatening situation to endanger life and Unnatural or imaginary fear which has no objective reality. The percentage of normal fear will be only five. Imaginary fears will come to ninety per cent.

Normal fear is healthy. It paves the way for one's progress. It preserves life. When someone gives up smoking because they are afraid of developing lung cancer, this is a healthy fear because the danger is real and there are constructive steps they can take to avoid it.

Imaginary fears cause diseases, deplete all energies in man and produce all sorts of feverish excitement, low vitality, uneasiness, discomfort, disharmony, etc. When there is an epidemic or cholera, or typhoid, fear is the predisposing cause. Man is terribly afraid of cholera, worries himself and imagines that the germs have entered his body. Imagination does serious havoc. He becomes a victim to the actual disease itself!

Fear can be managed by Meditation to overcome fear and anxiety with closed eyes in the early morning. Meditate on courage, the opposite of fear, for half an hour. Think of the advantages of courage and the disadvantages of fear. Practice the virtue during the day. Feel that you actually possess courage to an enormous degree. Manifest it in your daily life. In some weeks or months fear will be replaced by courage. Repeat the formula "Om courage" mentally, daily several times.

Also, fear can be managed by affirmations to overcome fear by thinking I am fearless, all-pervading Atman, I am not afraid of anything, Courage is my birthright, I behold the one Atman everywhere Everything is my own Self, Who is to be afraid of whom? And there is no duality for me and many more





By Creating visualization to overcome fear which includes sitting in a comfortable position for meditation, with a straight back, close your eyes and breathe naturally through our nose. Then spend a little time identifying what it is you are currently afraid of. Try to identify your deluded, unhealthy fears, such as the fear of dying, the fear of loss, the fear of failure, and so forth. Using your wisdom, try to understand that all these fears, and all dangers, arise because of your deluded minds and negative actions.

Pharmaceutical method or medications to manage fear; A drug treatment for fear conditioning and phobias via the amygdala is the use of glucocorticoids. In one study, glucocorticoid receptors in the central nucleus of the amygdala were disrupted in order to better understand the mechanisms of fear and fear conditioning. The glucocorticoid receptors were inhibited using lentiviral vectors containing Cre-recombinase injected into mice. Results showed that disruption of the glucocorticoid receptors prevented conditioned fear behavior. The mice were subjected to auditory cues which caused them to freeze normally. However, a reduction of freezing was observed in the mice that had inhibited glucocorticoid receptors.

Psychology is also used to manage fear; Cognitive behavioral therapy has been successful in helping people overcome fear. Because fear is more complex than just forgetting or deleting memories, an active and successful approach involves people repeatedly confronting their fears. By confronting their fears in a safe manner a person can suppress the fear-triggering memory or stimulus known as 'exposure therapy', this practice can help cure up to 90% of people, with specific phobias.

## GENOTOXICITY >>>

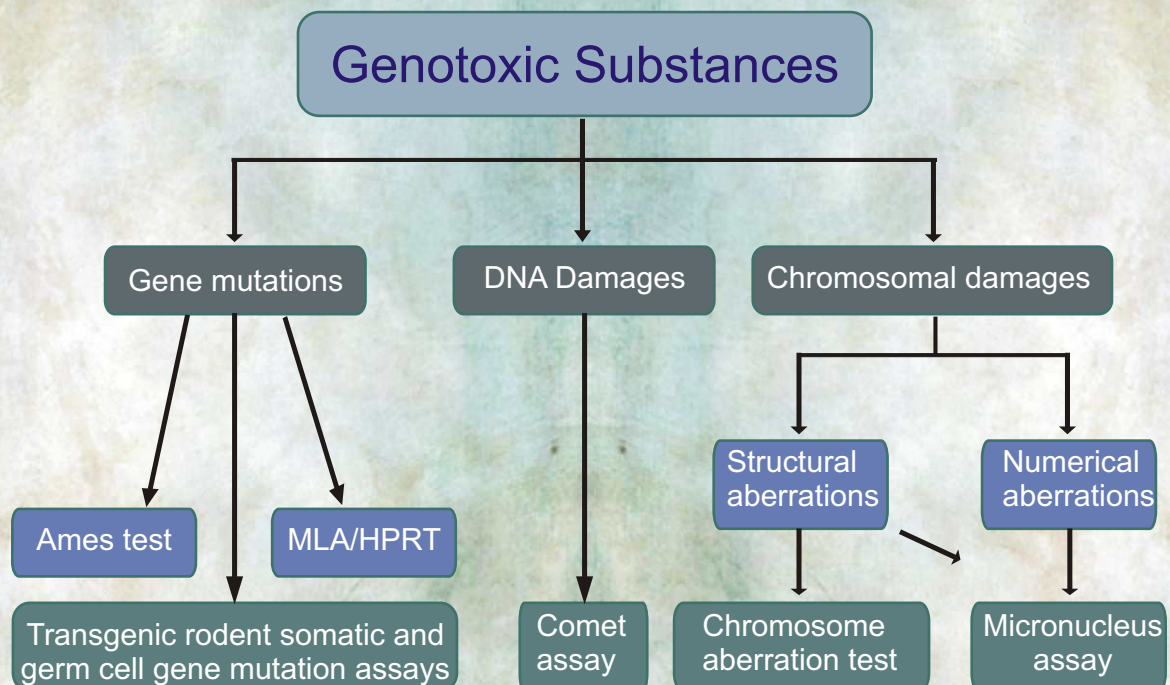

Possessions of chemical agents that damage the genetic information of the cells is known as genotoxicity. The genotoxic substances provoke changes by altering DNA sequence and structure. There exist many tests to detect the chemicals which can probably cause such changes such as ames test, comets test etc. To study genotoxic substances ICH-S2 Guideline has been formed by ICH which gives detail view about substances that can be genotoxic.

Delibrate changes in gene profile has been found to be done by many athletes to mask their genetic profile, which can help them to stay aloof from the doping investigators. Heritable changes can alter somatic or germ cells to pass to the future generations. This may even lead to cancer.

## CYBER PHARMACY AS A START-UP FOR ENTREPRENEURSHIP

An online pharmacy, internet pharmacy, or mail-order pharmacy is a pharmacy that operate over the Internet and sends the orders to customers through the mail or shipping companies. It is more convenient than traveling to a community drugstore, in the same way as ordering goods online rather than going to a shop . Buying drugs/medicines online is the latest trend amongst the Indian patients and consumers. With this increasing trend of buying medicines online, number of online pharmacies also in- crease. But there is lack of proper regulatory checks and balances for exercising regulatory control over e-pharmacies.

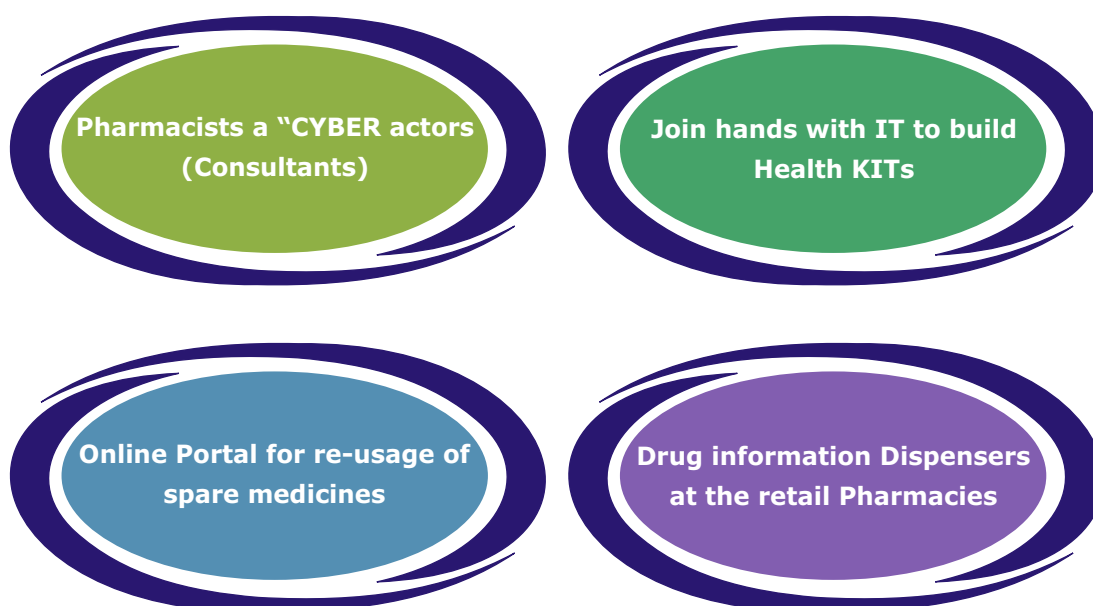
Drug control authorities in the country have been facing the challenge of regulating the internet sales of pharmaceutical products from 2014 with the emergence of these new class of traders .

Drugs and cosmetics act as well as Information Technology Act, 2000 are silent on the aspect of e-pharmacy. As a result, illegal e-pharmacies have been increasing in India . There is no legislation specific to data privacy in India as yet. Then, after repeated complaints from the retail chemists and wholesalers against the internet sales of medicines, the Drugs Controller General of India appointed a committee under Harshdeep Kamble, commissioner of Maharashtra FDA, to explore the possibility of allowing online trading in pharmaceuticals and laying down specific rules. Although the committee submitted its recommendations in this regard last year, no decision has been taken by the DCGI so far.

Due to lack of proper regulatory control over e-pharmacy the pharmacy professionals can be helpful for the techies.

By joining hands with IT professionals will enhance the start-up potential of cy-ber pharmacy. This orthogonality of professions will give a deeper insight to the life changing research.

## REVIEW ON HYPERTENSION

Cardiovascular (CV) diseases are the leading cause of death globally, representing ~ 30% of all mortality. Hypertension (HTN or HT) also known as high blood pressure (HBP), is a long-term medical condition in which the blood pressure in the arteries is persistently elevated. High blood pressure in long term may cause stroke, coronary artery disease, atrial fibrillation, heart failure, vision loss, peripheral vascular disease, dementia, and chronic kidney disease. There is a continuous, additive and linear relationship between blood pressure (BP) with diabetes, dyslipidemia, obesity, and cigarette smoking. In the majority of cases, hypertension is thought to result from an interaction of genes with environmental factors.

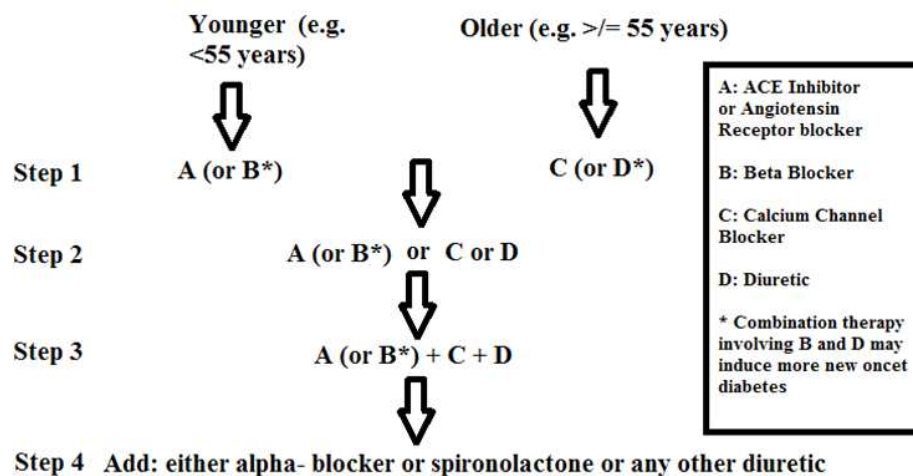
The hypertension, if left untreated, about 50 % of the patient die because of Coronary Artery Disease (CHD) or Congestive Heart Failure (CHF), 33% by stroke, and 10-15% die of renal failure.

The exact causes of hypertension are usually unknown; there are several factors that have been highly associated with the condition.

### FACTORS AFFECTING HYPERTENSION

- Smoking
- Obesity or being overweight
- Diabetes
- Sedentary lifestyle
- Lack of physical activity
- High levels of salt intake (sodium sensitivity)
- Insufficient calcium, potassium, and magnesium consumption
- Vitamin D deficiency
- High levels of alcohol consumption
- Stress

**Figure 1:** The British Hypertension Society Recommendations for the management of Hypertension





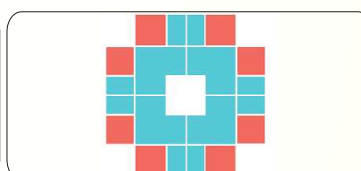

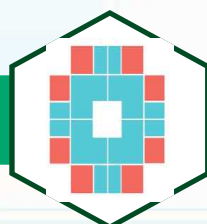

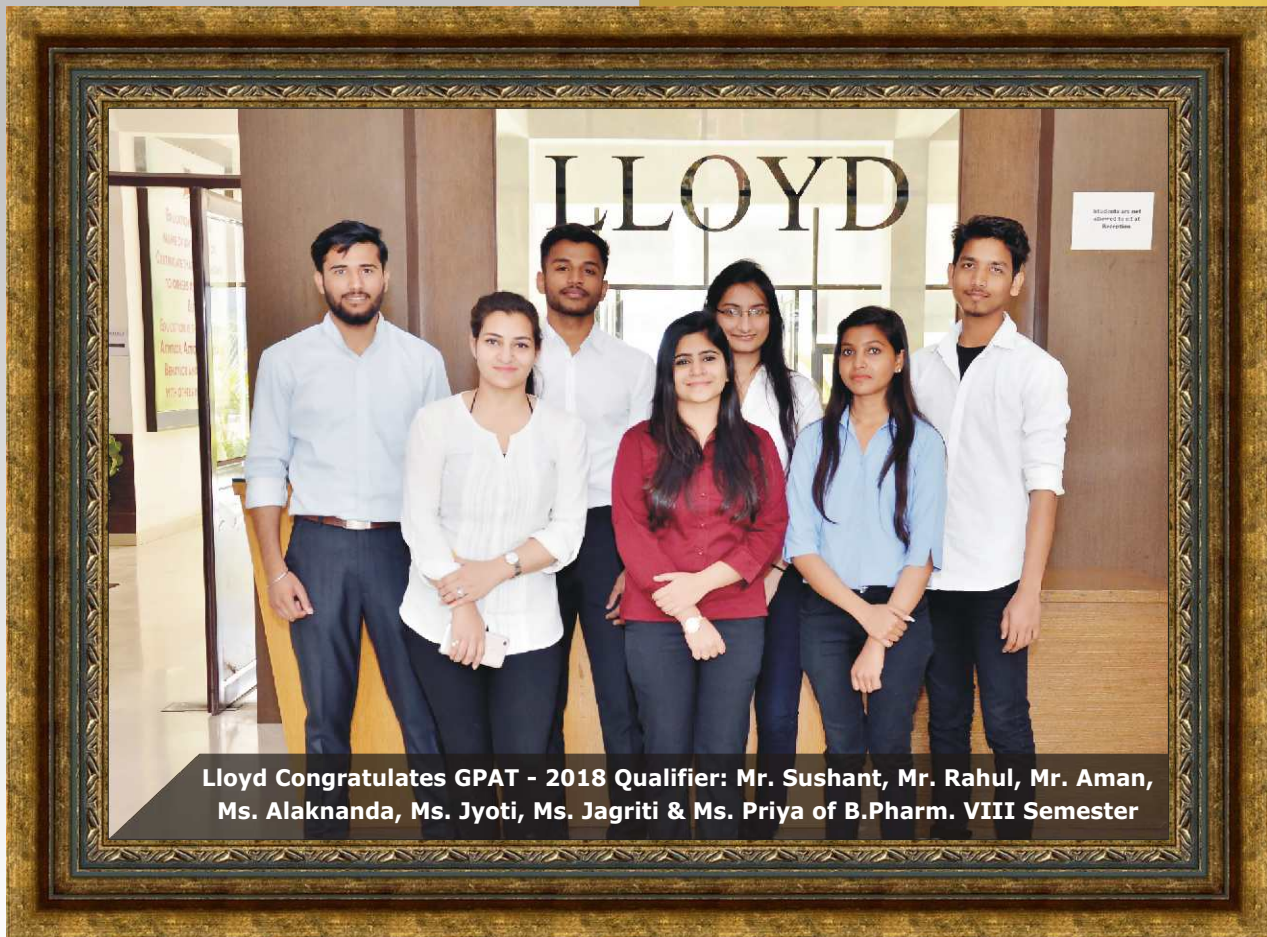
