



Should You Use Nutrition Supplement Drinks

For many individuals who are concerned about their appetite, weight loss or gain or health problems that make eating solid food difficult, nutrition supplement drinks are viable alternatives. Products such as Boost and Ensure, which come in a variety of flavors, are often used to provide protein and other nutrients to people who need a little boost to ensure they are able to keep their strength up and increase their intake of nutrients.

Protein is vital for building and repairing muscle and bone. It also helps maintain your immune system. It makes enzymes and hormones and transports nutrients throughout the body. Protein gives you energy and helps your body recover from illness, surgery, wounds and fractures. Unlike carbohydrates and fats, protein isn't stored in the body. You get it from eating assorted foods, such as lean chicken, fish, eggs, vegetables, cheese, nuts, peanut butter, whole grains and brown rice. The amount of protein you need depends on factors such as your age, weight and activity level. For healthy adults over age 19, the recommended dietary allowance is a minimum of 0.36 grams of protein per pound of body weight per day. For adults over 65, experts recommend even more protein – about 0.5 gram per pound of body weight per day. If you have trouble hitting the recommended numbers, a nutrition supplement drink could help make up the difference, filling in the gaps with the extra calories.

Most nutrition supplement drinks are carefully balanced to provide a beneficial, healthy mix of protein, carbohydrates, fat, vitamins and minerals. They are very convenient to use, which makes them even more appealing. Be sure to read the labels so you know exactly what is in the drink – especially note the amount of sugar if you are dealing with diabetes.

Your doctor may recommend a nutrition supplement drink if you:

- Have lost weight;
- Are inactive or not as active as you could or should be;
- Are recovering from an injury or surgery; or
- Have difficulty chewing solid foods.

While you may not need a prescription or a go-ahead from your doctor before trying a nutrition supplement drink, it's still a good idea to check with him or her to make sure the ingredients in the drink will not interfere with any medicines you are currently taking. For example, according to the Harvard Health Letter, some drinks contain vitamin K, and sudden changes in vitamin K intake may interfere with the effect of the blood thinning drug warfarin (Coumadin).

Nutrition supplement drinks are intended to serve as a meal supplement, not as an addition to a full meal. By themselves they provide just what is needed, but drinking one with or after a meal will provide too many calories. That can lead to weight gain and complications associated with obesity, such as diabetes and high blood pressure. If you're replacing a meal, look for a drink that offers about 400 calories per serving.

If you don't particularly like the taste of any of the nutrition supplement drinks available at the grocery or pharmacy, you may want to try making your own. Blend regular or nondairy milk with protein powder and fruit. To make fortified milk, mix one quart of whole or low-fat milk with a cup of powdered nonfat milk. You can also mix fruits or vegetables in Greek yogurt, cottage cheese or milk to create a protein supplement specific to your needs and tastes.

Covid-19 Impact on Education

As the coronavirus pandemic spreads across the globe and in India, many countries have confirmed school closures by mid-March 2020. However, School closures are an essential step in an attempt to prevent the community spread of the COVID-19 outbreak. It appears to be a logical solution to enforce social distances within community but prolonged closures tend to have a negative impact on students. Millions of learners world-wide are affected by the closure of educational institutions. This has changed the way millions have been taught worldwide. In a relatively short period, COVID-19 is a catalyst in the search of novel approaches for educational institutions worldwide. In a survey conducted by Times Higher Education in 2018, leaders of well-known global universities believed that online teaching could never match the conventional classroom teaching. Coronavirus pandemic has changed the way of education around the world and gives us an insight into how education will change for the better and the worse in the long term.



Impact and challenges:

- Classes, semester exams, and school admissions are lagging. The activities of student counseling are getting affected too. Many countries have opted to cancel or postpone tests. Whereas some are expanding the college or school year because of missed days.
- Most of Indian students rely on the offline admissions process and majority of the people do not have access to high-speed Wifi OR broadband.
- The shutdown has generated confusion about the exam process, internships and placements. It will be a major challenge for colleges to complete their syllabus on time without compromising the quality of education.
- Universities can face lower collection of fees that can generate hurdles in the managing of working capital.
- Many institutions can pause the hiring of faculties for existing vacancies, which affect the quality and excellence.
- Many students do not have access to the Internet and computers and they would have to miss their training before appropriate solutions could be found.
- Many people are dealing with technical problems, and even grappling with home study challenges.
- Students with special needs and young children are difficult to focus on. They may find it difficult to switch to online platforms and also to concentrate in an online class. These difficulties may require additional support from parents and a unique approach to online learning.
- Sectors of higher education are also disrupted. Many Indian students have taken admissions abroad and because of coronavirus pandemic, students will withdraw their admission. The market for foreign higher education will also decrease in the long term.
- Employment is another big problem. Students who have graduated will fear that because of the current situation, they may cancel their employment offers in the corporate sector. There are possibilities that the placements in 2020 decrease as the global economy falls drastically.

Opportunities:

- Despite the challenges set out above, the change in education also means that more opportunities are developing and are becoming available to students.
- Educational policy makers should take advantage the virus outbreak as an opportunity to implement new learning techniques that will benefit everybody, plan for emergencies and make the program more resilient. Regional

lockdowns could be used as a best test for remote learning education technology operations. Many countries are using distance learning to reduce the lack of school time.

- Open and free cost access of digital textbooks and learning materials have been given by various publishers.
- National TV networks are broadcasting educational lectures and study materials. Various Government and non-government organizations are providing free online courses.
- Artificial intelligence, too, will help make learning more productive and personal. Most students are also gradually using podcasts and using Youtube. WhatsApp and Instagram social networking sites are now commonly used for more casual and immersive learning.
- Faculties are learning through online platforms. They are translating materials and lessons into a new framework. They are also adapting the latest online tools for remote teaching and connectivity. They are looking to create a successful schedule outside the school environment.
- Teachers, often among the most educated in these hard-to-reach areas, can be trained as contact trackers and campaign advocates.
- Schools can serve as crisis response centers. They can be transformed into makeshift holding centers during a crisis, especially during the recovery and coping phases.

A virtual Industrial trip to Yakult Danone India Pvt. Ltd was held on 7th August 2020. Mr. Aadish, Executive, P R Department took the students to virtual industrial tour. Yakult is the world's leading probiotic beverage created in Japan in 1935. Today, Yakult is sold in 39 countries and regions around the world. The company's portfolio included a range of consumer, cosmetic and pharmaceutical products. Mr. Aadish briefed that Science and research are the basis of their business. He told that Yakult have institutes in both Japan and Europe that are committed to discover the endless applications for probiotics as well as the use of intestinal bacteria in human health globally. A virtual trip through the company's state-of-the-art facility, was taken up by their team leader and students were shown about manufacturing of probiotics. The automated blow, fill and seal technology was shown. Students witnessed then the stringent aseptic conditions of the company and learnt about various manufacturing operations.

He also shared the entire step-by-step process of GMP inspection by FDA and elaborated on a few important terms such as Misbranded drugs, Quality Control, Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (API), etc. and various guidelines. He elaborated on the term GMP as a Good Manufacturing Practice system that ensures the quality of manufacturing products, like food, drugs, medicines, cosmetics, and pharmaceutical goods that should be consistently produced and controlled according to set quality standards. He discussed GMP and as an applicable tool to all aspects of quality, starting from raw materials to finished dosage forms and encompassing the safety & efficacy of the product. He elaborated on the contents under the GMP like quality management, Sanitation and hygiene, Building and facilities/premises, Equipment, Raw materials, Personnel, Validation and qualification, Handling complaints, Documentation, and recordkeeping, Inspections & quality audits. He even emphasized on Pharmaceutical Quality Systems ICHQ10 Guideline. Besides, he also explained how to sustain GMP Compliance that comprised of the Quality team, Documentation validation, surprise audits, and compliance training. He took his interest and time in answering the follow-up questions from participants.

The next day began with a warm welcome to Prof. Shubhini A. Saraf, Dean, Dept. of Pharm. Sciences, Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Lucknow. She spoke on the topic titled, "3D Printing and its Relevance in the Post Covid-19 Scenario". She started with the basic introduction of 3D printing and its general idea behind it. She explained her concept by putting forward the basic question on how learners could use this insight of 3D application in this pandemic era. She mainly focused on the benefits of 3D printing in the medical application like customization and personalization. This idea could be used in medical applications like medical devices, biologics like developing Lung tissues and Drugs, etc. However, there are already various types of 3D printed products into the market like, Surgical & Dental Guides, Prosthetics and Limbs, Tissue Engineering Products, etc. Finally, she talked that India is not lagging behind with these inventions around the globe. Several universities and institutions in India are now using 3D printers to make face shields and ventilators splitters.

The third day of this e-FDP started with a brief introduction to Dr. Anwar R. Shaikh, Professor & HOD, Dept. of Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Allana College of Pharmacy, Pune. 
